meetings and gatherings

General Meetings--Guests Welcome

General meetings are held twice a year (in May and September). We are planning to resume meeting in person with online participation via Zoom or a similar platform. Historically our in-person meetings have had a 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. schedule. A \$12 registration fee has been charged for both members and guests to cover the cost of renting a facility and for refreshments. For our future hybrid meetings, a decision will be made whether to go with an all-day format or only a half day. We know that all day on Zoom can be tiring. The meeting location is still to be determined. Those attending in person are welcome to bring guests. Non-members wanting to attend remotely will be asked to request access to the link.

For Maine Poets' Society Members

Winter gatherings currently include a workshop (with a limited number of attendees if in-person), and a members-only "Reading in the Round" on Zoom.

Meetings have included:

- ❖ a brief business meeting
- ❖ open mic (sign up on registration; preference given to those who have not submitted a poem for the contest)
- ❖ workshop and/or discussion
- ❖ lunch (with attendees bringing a bag lunch)
- ❖ poetry contest results
- ❖ critique of winning poems by the contest judge, followed by a reading of his/her own work

contests

One contest, open to members only, is held in conjunction with each gathering to give opportunity and encouragement to keep writing and to receive constructive feedback, recognition, and praise from knowledgeable judges. Subject/form and line limit for each contest are announced in the preceding newsletter. Poems are sent anonymously to judges who make written decisions and comments on each entry, presented orally at the meeting. Judges' choices of the top three entries in each contest are recognized with certificates, cash awards, and publication in the newsletter. Honorable mentions for each contest are awarded certificates and are also included in the newsletter.

history

The Waterville Poets Club and the Dover-Foxcroft Poetry Circle joined in 1936 to form the Poetry Fellowship of Maine. In 1993, the name was changed to Maine Poets Society to reflect the organization's changing emphasis on a statewide network of writers sharing their work.
